



Feds Designate Critical Habitat for Sea Otters in Southwest Alaska



Today, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (U.S.F&WS) designated more than 5,800 square miles as critical habitat for sea otters in the Aleutian Islands, Bering Sea and Alaska Peninsula. Four years ago, sea otters in southwest Alaska were placed on the Endangered Species List. Critical habitat is required under the Endangered Species Act. An environmental group filed a lawsuit to force the federal government to act more quickly with added protection for the animals.

Crews Begin Construction of FAA Tower in Cold Bay

Crews began construction of a 35-foot-tall tower for the F.A.A. this week in Cold Bay. It will serve primarily as a communications tower. It will include sensors/receivers for taking telemetry from nearby weather and other communication devices. The tower is located next to the Cold Bay Terminal Building. Completion is projected to occur on October 20, 2009.
