# FOOD SERVICE

AEBSD HAS A FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM IN THE KING COVE AND SAND POINT SCHOOLS. THE FOOD SERVICE PROGRAMS ARE FUNDED INTERNALLY THROUGH A GENERAL FUND TRANSFER (\$144,928 BUDGET ESTIMATE AMOUNT) AND WITH FOOD SERVICE RECEIPTS (\$6,800 BUDGET ESTIMATE AMOUNT). ALL STUDENTS EAT FOR FREE. ADULT MEALS ARE AVAILABLE FOR \$5 EACH. THE DISTRICT HAS AN AGREEMENT WITH APIA HEAD START TO PROVIDE LUNCH TO HEAD START STUDENTS AND HEAD START STAFF. APIA REIMBURSES THE DISTRICT AT A PREDETERMINED AND AGREED UPON AMOUNT PER MEAL.




**AEBSD** provides Pupil Transportation services at the King Cove and Sand Point Schools. Each site makes multiple BUS RUNS EVERY SCHOOL DAY. ALL STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE. AVERAGE DAILY RIDERSHIP IS ESTIMATED AT 84% PARTICIPATION. PUPIL TRANSPORTATION IS GENERALLY FUNDED BY A STATE (DEED) PUPIL TRANSPORTATION GRANT. THE GRANT AMOUNT IS DETERMINED BY THE STATE (DEED) BY TAKING THE PROJECTED ADM TIMES STATE (DEED) DETERMINED PER-CHILD COST. FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR, THAT AMOUNT IS \$343 PER ADM. FOR FY20 THE ESTIMATED GRANT AMOUNT IS \$74,431.

# PEAKS 2017-2019 Comparison




#### Percent Proficiency AEBSD versus State




#### Mathematcs Proficiency AEBSD versus State

#### **OPPORTUNITIES FOR FALSE PASS SCHOOL**

• FALSE PASS SCHOOL IS IN YEAR 3 OF SAFE HARBOR. WHAT THIS MEANS IS THAT AT THE END OF THE 2019-20 SCHOOLYEAR FALSE PASS SCHOOL WILL NO LONGER RECEIVE ADDITIONAL SMALL SCHOOL FUNDING FROM THE STATE OF ALASKA. • KEEPING FALSE PASS SCHOOL OPEN WILL REQUIRE A CREATIVE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE CITY OF FALSE PASS, THE TRIBE, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, COLD BAY PARENTS AND THE BOROUGH..... Q: SO WHAT COULD WE DO? A: THINK OUT OF THE BOX ...

• Q: COULD COLD BAY STUDENTS CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN OTHER STATEWIDE CORRESPONDENCE PROGRAMS BECOME PART OF FALSE PASS SCHOOL?

• A: Yes. This could get the numbers at False Pass above the 10 student threshold

# • Q: WHAT WOULD BE THE BENEFIT TO COLD BAY STUDENTS?

• A: IT WOULD ALLOW STUDENTS TO INTERACT MORE CLOSELY WITH STUDENTS FROM COLD BAY - FALSE PASS AND VISA VERSA.

#### • Q: How could this happen?

• A: I HAVE SPOKEN WITH MR. SILLS, FALSE PASS TEACHER/PRINCIPAL AND HE IS INTERESTED IN WAYS TO ENCOURAGE INTERACTIONS BETWEEN FALSE PASS Students and Cold Bay students. Mr. Sills wife is a MANAGER AT SILVER BAY SEAFOODS AND SHE COULD LIKELY ARRANGE FOR THE "TRANSPORTER" TO PERIODICALLY MOVE STUDENTS BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN COLD BAY AND FALSE PASS TO INCREASE STUDENT INTERACTIONS. ADDITIONALLY, STUDENTS FROM COLD BAY COULD VISIT SAND POINT SCHOOL IN THE SPRING TO TAKE PART IN THE SWIMMING PROGRAM.

#### • Q: WHAT ABOUT STAFFING?

• A: The district could look at possibly putting a paraprofessional in Cold Bay while Mr. Sills could be the principal and teacher. We could also assist with tech support and maybe even devices.

#### • Q: HOW WOULD THE PROGRAM WORK?

• A: MR. SILLS WOULD BE IN CHARGE OF GETTING THIS PROGRAM UP AND RUNNING AND WOULD BE IN CHARGE OF ASSIGNING GRADES ETC. HE WOULD COLLABORATE WITH PARENTS AND COMMUNITY TO DELIVER A QUALITY PROGRAM. IT WOULD LIKELY BE PART DISTANCE DELIVERY, PART PROJECT BASED LEARNING AND PART USPS.

This is an innovative and creative plan that could HAVE LONG TERM BENEFITS AT MULTIPLE LEVELS. MY HOPE WOULD BE THAT WE COULD ALL WORK TOGETHER TO CREATE A PHENOMENAL PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS. The False Pass economy has a great deal of GROWTH POTENTIAL WITH THE CURRENT SILVER BAY SEAFOODS DEVELOPMENT SCHEDULE. THE BIG ISSUE, AS WE ALL KNOW, IS HOUSING. FOR THIS TO WORK THE CITY OF FALSE PASS AND THE TRIBE WOULD NEED TO PARTNER IN DEVELOPING 8 HOUSING UNITS THAT ARE ABLE TO BE OCCUPIED WITHIN TWO YEARS. THIS HOUSING WOULD ACCOMMODATE TEACHERS AND MANAGEMENT STAFF FROM SILVER BAY WHICH WOULD LIKELY BRING IN

CHILDREN TO ADD TO THE SCHOOL ROLLS.

IN ADDITION, AS PART OF THIS LONG TERM PLAN, IT IS MY INTENT TO ASK THE AEBSD BOARD TO FORMALLY VOICE THEIR SUPPORT, THROUGH VOTE, FOR KEEPING FALSE PASS SCHOOL OPEN. AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE WOULD ESSENTIALLY BE AN ASK FROM THE BOROUGH TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO KEEP THE SCHOOL OPEN FOR TWO SCHOOL YEARS BEYOND 2019-20.
